Pastor's Corner

Last Sunday we celebrated our annual Festival of Trees and Lights. It was another beautiful sign of Church community and the call to live a life of charity. We know that the actual proceeds of this event will only make a small dent in the needs of our downtown poor and homeless, but the Grace that overshadows us and our community from these important festivities will multiply throughout our downtown and in our own lives. I thank everyone who worked so hard to make the festival so enjoyable and filled with the promise of the joy of Christmas.

As we continue to pray for guidance in how we might make Christ more real for the poor and homeless, as well as our own families, we can use the image of John the Baptist, who gave his own life so that others would know Christ. John told his own disciples that he was not the Christ. It was an important message both for himself and others. There is only one Christ. We, however, can behave as though we are Christ. We can be judgmental and all-knowing, self-important and self-centered, expecting others to worship and obey us, and fill ourselves with an attitude of superiority and magnanimity.

Usually when we act like a God we are far from living the image of the one true God. It is the most beautiful irony that the Christ, deserving of all praise and glory, lived the most humble, human life. As we approach the Christmas season, the season of giving, the more godly we wish to become requires more sacrifices we need to make. After all, we may not be Christ, but we are His body. What a great gift He has given us on Christmas.

LAS POSADAS

Beginning on December 16 and ending nine days later, on December 24, *Las Posadas* commemorates the nine months of Mary's pregnancy. Each night, one family agrees to house the pilgrims. And so it begins: At dusk, a procession of the faithful takes to the streets with children often dressed as angels and shepherds. Religious figures, images and lighted candles are a part of the festivities.



The group representing the Holy Family stands outside a series of houses, singing songs, asking for lodging. They are refused time and again until the group reaches the designated house. Finally, the travelers are permitted to enter. Prayer and song continue in the home, and festive foods are shared. The evening ends with a *piñata* in the shape of star.

The tradition continues each evening with a different house as the chosen Posadas. The last night—Christmas Eve—usually features a midnight Mass. The nine days of *Las Posadas* is more than just a feel-good tradition: It deepens faith and strengthens ties within the community at a holy time.

Question:

The Church teaches that, through our baptism, we are made priest, prophet, and king like Christ. What does it mean for us to be prophets in the world today?

Answer:

We are indeed sharers in the threefold mission of Christ. We live our "kingship" when we serve others in justice, work for the common good in society, and overcome sin in our own lives. Our "priestly" mission is lived when we unite our lives to Christ's sacrifice on the cross, offering them up as a gift of love. We are also called to be prophets. Our lives may not look like Isaiah and Jeremiah of old — and perhaps desert living and locust eating like St. John the Baptist might feel out of reach — but this doesn't nullify our invitation and obligation.

As baptized Christians, we have accepted the Gospel in faith. We're also called to proclaim the Gospel as well. This may mean by giving Christ-centered advice to another person or defending truth when it's threatened. It also means living our faith in deeds.

St. John Paul II writes that we are "called to allow the newness and the power of the Gospel to shine out every day in [our] family and social life" (On the Lay Members of Christ's Faithful, 14). A prophet points to a higher truth beyond himself or herself. We live prophetically when we treat others as Christ treated people and when we arrange our schedule to prioritize those to whom we have the greatest obligation, including our families, as well as the poor and vulnerable around us. We live prophetically when we think critically about the culture around us and we allow our faith to inform our public life.

Gaudete Sunday

The season of Advent originated as a fast of 40 days in preparation for Christmas, commencing on the day after the feast of Saint Martin (11 November), whence it was often called *Saint Martin's Lent*, a name by which it was known as early as the fifth century. In the ninth century, the duration of Advent was reduced to four weeks (a period starting four Sundays before Christmas), and Advent preserved most of the characteristics of a penitential season which made it a kind of counterpart to Lent. Gaudete Sunday is a counterpart to Laetare Sunday, and provides a similar break about midway through a season which is otherwise of a penitential character, and signifies the nearness of the Lord's coming.

The spirit of the liturgy all through Advent is one of expectation and preparation for the feast of Christmas as well as for the second coming of Christ, and the penitential exercises suitable to that spirit are thus on Gaudete Sunday suspended, as it were, for a while in order to symbolize that joy and gladness in the promised Redemption.

While the theme of Advent is a focus on the coming of Jesus in three ways: his first, his present, and his final Advent, the readings for Gaudete Sunday deal with rejoicing in the Lord – Christian joy – as well as the mission of John the Baptist and his connection with Advent. The theologian Henri Nouwen described the difference between joy and happiness. While happiness is dependent on external conditions, joy is "the experience of knowing that you are unconditionally loved and that nothing – sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death – can take that love away." Thus joy can be present even in the midst of sadness.

On Gaudete Sunday rose-colored vestments may be worn instead of violet (or instead of deep blue, in some Anglican and Lutheran traditions), which is otherwise prescribed for every day in the season of Advent. Gaudete Sunday was also known as "Rose Sunday".

In churches that have an Advent wreath, the rose colored candle is lit in addition to two of the violet (or blue) colored candles, which represent the first two Sundays of Advent. Despite the otherwise somber readings of the season of Advent, which has as a secondary theme the need for penitence, the readings on the third Sunday emphasize the joyous anticipation of the Lord's coming. BIBLE STUDY BEGINS ON JANUARY 9, 2020



DID YOU KNOW...

The use of wrapping paper is first documented in ancient China, where paper was invented in the 2nd century BC. In the Southern Song dynasty, monetary gifts were enclosed in an envelope known as a chih pao. Early wrapping paper was likely to be strong and roughly textured, and created from hemp or rice straws and bamboo fibers.

In Chinese culture, red wrapping paper is particularly auspicious, signifying happiness and good health. The Japanese are famous for the beauty of their gift wrapping but there is now a strong return to the traditional cloth wrapping known as furoshiki, which has the advantage of being better for the environment.

In the West, commercial manufactured wrapping paper developed from fancy French papers used for lining envelopes and was particularly popular in the United States. (JacquieLawson.com)

LAS POSADAS

Comenzando el 16 de diciembre y terminando nueve días después, el 24 de diciembre, Las Posadas conmemora los nueve meses del embarazo de Mary. Cada noche, una familia acepta alojar a los peregrinos. Y así comienza: al anochecer, una procesión de fieles sale a la calle con niños a menudo vestidos de ángeles y pastores. Figuras religiosas, imágenes y velas encendidas son parte de las festividades.

El grupo que representa a la Sagrada Familia se para afuera de una serie de casas, cantando canciones, pidiendo alojamiento. Se les rechaza una y otra vez hasta que el grupo llega a la casa designada. Finalmente, los viajeros pueden ingresar. La oración y la canción continúan en el hogar, y se comparten comidas festivas. La tarde termina con una piñata en forma de estrella.



La tradición continúa cada noche con una casa diferente como las Posadas elegidas. La última noche, la víspera de Navidad, generalmente presenta una misa de medianoche. Los nueve días de Las Posadas es más que una simple tradición de sentirse bien: profundiza la fe y fortalece los lazos dentro de la comunidad en un momento sagrado.

MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO

El tercer Domingo de Adviento recibe el nombre de Gaudet, que significa alegría. "Estén siempre alegres en el Señor; se lo repito, estén alegres y tengan buen trato con todos" (Filipenses 4:4), dice la antífona de entrada. La oración colectiva también nos lleva a reflexionar en el significado permanente de esta alegría: "Mira, Señor, a tu pueblo que espera con fe la fiesta del nacimiento de tu Hijo, y concédele celebrar el gran misterio de nuestra salvación con un corazón nuevo y una inmensa alegría." El Profeta Isaías lo afirma con sus palabras de esperanza a su pueblo: "¡Animo! no teman. He aquí que su Dios, vengador y justiciero, viene ya para salvarlos."

La Navidad se acerca y su luz nos envuelve y llena de esplendor. Todo el ambiente es de fiesta y preparación. Las celebraciones Marianas nos han dejado ese gozo de albergue y acogida al que lo necesita. Ha, si comprendiéramos el motivo de alegría que decimos celebrar, entenderíamos perfectamente que se debe a que Dios y su salvación están cerca. La alegría y la salvación van juntas, no se pueden separar, nos dice la Liturgia. Por este motivo, Juan se

VIVIR LA LITURGIA - INSPIRACIÓN DE LA SEMANA

¿Alguna vez te has sentido interiormente seco y partido? ¿A dónde recurrés para obtener un sentido renovado de tu ser y propósito?
