## *Pastor's Corner*

Just a few weeks ago, the tree in front of our rectory, having lived for decades alongside our church, came crashing down. In many ways, the tree was a nuisance. Its leaves falling and getting into the church, it getting in the way of parking, and it providing a place for crows to roost, making a big mess on everything below. Still, the tree's presence was a far greater gift than any of its detractions. These positive qualities are often harder to make sense of. Its beauty, magnificence, and testament to the years our parish has flourished help give meaning to who we are. Its witness to the countless weddings, baptisms, changes to Sacrament and its resident homeless help ground us in what we are doing. This tree's gifts, beyond a simple description of its usefulness, reveal the one thing a tree is supposed to do, glorify its Maker.

On Good Friday, all of creation crashed and split open over the death of The Maker. For the first time, God revealed to His creation, the stars, the planets, the trees, the children, what life would be like without Him. For the first time we understood what death really means for us. Creation ceased to exist. Without a God to glorify, all life and all meaning died. On Good Friday we all crashed and split open and revealed our nothingness. We crucified ourselves and all we cared for on that beautiful cross.

Yet, today is Easter glory, the day our Lover says, "everything is okay. You are not dead. I am here. I am alive!"

Today is resurrection and we will never experience death again because our Maker is eternally alive! Like our great tree, and all of creation, we embrace the Good News and simply glorify God.

Joyous Easter everyone.

A **candidate** is someone who has been previously baptized in another Christian faith. At the Easter Vigil, candidates will not be baptized since Baptism marks us with an indelible character. In other words, we may be baptized only once. Instead, candidates make a profession of faith, are confirmed, and receive the Eucharist.

**Catechumens** are those individuals who have never been officially initiated into a church community prior to their entrance into the Catholic Church. At the Easter Vigil, catechumens celebrate all three Sacraments of Christian Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. Another way we state this is to say that catechumens are seeking full communion with the Church.

### Celebrating the Gift of the Holy Spirit on Easter Sunday

On the night before the Crucifixion, Jesus promised His disciples that He would send them the Holy Spirit, "the Spirit of Truth", "the Comforter", "whom the world cannot receive because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you and shall be in you" (John 14:17, 26). During the earthly ministry of Jesus the Holy Spirit was at work in the disciples, for He was "with them" even if He was not yet in them. Jesus also promised that whosoever believes in Him and has received the Holy Spirit would do "the works that I do . . . and greater works than these shall he do, because I go to the Father" (Ibid. vs. 12).

After Jesus rose from the dead, He appeared in His resurrected body to the disciples who were in hiding and "opened their understanding that they might understand the scriptures, and said unto them, 'Thus it is written, and thus it behooved Christ to suffer, and to rise from the dead the third day'; and then He commands them to "Wait for the promise of the Father, which ye have heard of me. For John truly baptized with water; but ye shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit not many days hence . . . and ye shall receive power after that the Holy Spirit is come upon you and ye shall be witnesses unto me . . ." (Luke 24:45-49; Acts 1:4-8). These familiar passages have led many to believe that the Day of Pentecost was the day the Holy Spirit was given to the disciples of Jesus. This, however, is not entirely correct. The "promise of the Father", the Holy Spirit, "the Spirit of Truth", "The Comforter" Whom Jesus promised at the Last Supper was actually given to them on Easter Sunday.

When Jesus appeared to them on Easter Sunday evening, He had to convince them that He was not a ghost, but was in fact their crucified Lord raised from the dead. When they were troubled and afraid at the sight of what they thought was an ominous specter, He said unto them, "Why are ye troubled, and why do these thoughts arise in your hearts? Behold my hands and my feet, that it is I myself: handle me and see, for a spirit hath not flesh and bones as ye see me have"; when they still did not believe that it was actually Jesus, He asked for something to eat, and they "gave him a piece of broiled fish and of a honeycomb. And he took it and ate it before them". The Scripture tells us, "Then were the disciples glad when they saw the Lord" (Luke 24:36-43; John 20:20).

Having established that He was in fact alive from the grave, He greeted them a second time with the blessing, "Peace be unto you" (which we of course recall and pass on to each other at the "Kiss of Peace" during Mass); He then "Breathed on them and said, 'Receive ye the Holy Spirit . . .'" (John 20:21-23). This was the birth of the Church, "which men enter through Baptism as through a door" (Catechism, paragraph # 846), and why also we anoint the newly baptized, even infants, with Holy Chrism: when they are baptized they receive the Holy Spirit and are inaugurated into the sacred ministry of the Church as prophets, priests, and kings.

Fifty days from now we will celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit in power upon the Church; it was on that day—the Day of Pentecost—that the ministry and anointing of the Church that was received on Easter Sunday was "confirmed" and strengthened. But on this blessed day, Easter Sunday, we celebrate the Resurrection and the initial gift of the Holy Spirit upon the fledgling Church. That gift was the down payment of the power and grace the Holy Spirit would fully bestow on the Church on Pentecost Sunday.




