

# Pastor's Corner

I have recently come to the end of several weeks of vacation. During this time, I have enjoyed being with family and friends while trying to process the significant moments that impact my life. It's important to get away every now and then to gain a better perspective and to sift through the many events that either need to be embraced or need to be released. However, to get away from the ordinary parts of our lives requires that we leave behind important everyday realities that still need our attention. For me, that important, everyday reality is being the pastor of the Cathedral.



My last day of vacation was the celebration for the memorial for St. Francis de Sales, Bishop and Doctor of the church. The prayers the church recites for his memorial come from the common of pastors. One of the prayers (antiphons) for a pastor is: "Let your light shine before men that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father." I meditated on that beautiful thought in relationship to me being a pastor. The simple fact of letting my light, the light of Christ, shine before the Cathedral community is all that is needed to glorify the Father. Sometimes life can appear overwhelming and we think there is no way we will be able to fix everything. People arguing, financial worries, illness, death, homelessness, politicians, bad news, and empty churches can cause us to halt, retreat, and lose sleep. Yet, Jesus tells us to simply let our light shine and focus on the Father. That same light will transform the negatives into signs of God's presence and problems will be resolved through Christ alone.

As a pastor, my role is to simply reveal the light of Christ so that others give glory to God. Often this requires that I don't allow myself to get in the way. To be a light is to simply remain positive, faithful and trust in the power and love of Christ. Many of us are pastors, guiding our little flocks. We pray for the grace to simply allow the light of Christ to shine and so glorify our heavenly Father.

## THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

At the end of the fourth century, a woman named Etheria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Her journal, discovered in 1887, gives an unprecedented glimpse of liturgical life there. Among the celebrations she describes is the Epiphany, the observance of Christ's birth, and the gala procession in honor of his Presentation in the Temple 40 days later. Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification." Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or death—excluded a person from Jewish worship. This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification.

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

### Reflection

In Luke's account, Jesus was welcomed in the temple by two elderly people, Simeon and the widow Anna. They embody Israel in their patient expectation; they acknowledge the infant Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah. Early references to the Roman feast dub it the feast of Saint Simeon, the old man who burst into a song of joy which the Church still sings at day's end. ## WHY IS THE GOSPEL LED BY CANDLES AND INCENSE AT MASS?

### The solemn Gospel procession has rich symbolism rooted in a reverence for the Word of God.

In the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church, there is a procession of the Gospel that occurs on more solemn celebrations. If enough servers are present, the Gospel is accompanied by two lighted candles and a thurible holding incense.

This tradition has a long history, dating possibly to the 3rd or 4th centuries. Nikolaus Gehr, in his book *The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass*, explains the symbolism of the **candles**.

*St. Jerome already defended the higher meaning of this very ancient custom of lighting candles at the Gospel, inasmuch as he insists that thereby we should give expression to the joy and jubilation of our hearts at the good tidings of salvation. — Above all, the light by its brightness and its glow symbolizes Jesus Christ, the Sun that knows no setting and the Light of the City of God as well on earth as in heaven. By means of the Gospel Christ is the light of the world; by the Gospel God has called us to the wonderful light of Christian truth and grace. In this dark vale of the earth "Thy word is a lamp to my feet, and a light to my paths" (Ps. 118, 105)...*


*From the word of God beams a secure light to guide us amid the various directions and helps, as well as amid the various wants, obstacles and dangers we meet on this path so stern and so difficult to be determined.*

The presence of candles at the Gospel also **heightens our awareness** at Mass, alerting us to something important that is happening in the sanctuary. The Gospel contains the words of Jesus himself and so we are exhorted to pay special attention to his message.

With regard to **incense**, the symbolism is also rich and points to a deeper spiritual reality.

*In the first place, the incensing of the Book of the Gospels is to be regarded as an act of holy reverence, a religious mark of honor paid to "the words of eternal life," which the Lord here speaks to us. —*

*The fragrant clouds that envelop the book call to mind how by the announcement of the Gospel is spread abroad and around the good odor of the pre-eminent knowledge of Jesus Christ... The incense furthermore admonishes us, with what heavenly ardor of devotion the words of the Gospel should be announced by the deacon and also by the priest, and be listened to by the faithful and laid up in their hearts. — As the bright flame of the lighted taper is an image of a pure life, so the sweet fragrance of incense also symbolizes, finally, a virtuous, God-fearing life... Virtue, indeed, exhales a sweet and a refreshing perfume; to prove this, the Lord has often wonderfully effected that the bodies of the saints in their life-time or after their death exhaled a sweet scent, altogether supernatural and heavenly.*



## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

### Healing Our Blindness

The value of stewardship living is difficult to see unless we are experiencing that way of life for ourselves. You can read 100 Everyday Stewardship reflections and go to church every Sunday, but unless you are actively growing in faith and trying to live a life of generous stewardship, you cannot see the power of such a lifestyle. Like most things, we need direct, purposeful experiences to really understand.

I worked in a stewardship parish for over 20 years, but it was only after I started treating all I have as God's and began to actively offer all I am to Him for His glory, that I really got the message. That doesn't mean I am a perfect steward. Far from it! However, the stress and anxiety that comes with life has greatly diminished because all is in God's hands. I choose to act more generously than before, which provides me with a sense of fulfillment and joy. How I act towards my family, friends, and even people I meet daily has changed. Now I am more mindful of their presence, and I seek to give them a part of me that just might change their day and bring them a little closer to Christ. I am transforming into a disciple who seeks to use all I have been given to transform all that is around me.

It would be a shame to be blind to the important things for an entire life. Today, consider taking a path of life-changing stewardship. Give it all to God. In the midst of all you have been given, you just might find God in a profound way. You may even find the real person God created you to be.

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### Question:

Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?

### Answer:

Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Priests will joke that they cover a thousand flaws. But our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, and for special guests. We wear certain clothes for golf, for outdoor activities, and years ago, we even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning. The alb is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The stole is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons. First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated. Secondly, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.





# Esquina del Pastor

Recientemente he llegado al final de varias semanas de vacaciones. Durante este tiempo, disfruté estar con mi familia y amigos mientras trataba de procesar los momentos importantes que impactan mi vida. Es importante alejarse de vez en cuando para obtener una mejor perspectiva y examinar los muchos eventos que necesitan ser acogidos o deben ser liberados. Sin embargo, alejarse de las partes ordinarias de nuestras vidas requiere que dejemos atrás realidades cotidianas importantes que aún necesitan nuestra atención. Para mí, esa realidad importante y cotidiana es ser el pastor de la Catedral.

Mi último día de vacaciones fue la celebración del monumento a San Francisco de Sales, obispo y doctor de la iglesia. Las oraciones que la iglesia recita para su memorial provienen del común de los pastores. Medité en ese hermoso pensamiento en relación a mí como pastor. El simple hecho de dejar que mi luz, la luz de Cristo, brille ante la comunidad de la Catedral es todo lo que se necesita para glorificar al Padre. A veces la vida puede parecer abrumadora y creemos que no hay manera de que podamos arreglarlo todo. Las personas que discuten, las preocupaciones financieras, la enfermedad, la muerte, la falta de vivienda, los políticos, las malas noticias y las iglesias vacías pueden hacernos detener, retirarnos y perder el sueño. Sin embargo, Jesús nos dice que simplemente dejemos que nuestra luz brille y nos enfoquemos en el Padre. Como pastor, mi papel es simplemente revelar la luz de Cristo para que otros le den gloria a Dios. A menudo esto requiere que no me permita interponerme en el camino. ## LA PRESENTACIÓN DEL SEÑOR

A finales del siglo IV, una mujer llamada Etheria hizo una peregrinación a Jerusalén. Su diario, descubierto en 1887, ofrece una visión sin precedentes de la vida litúrgica allí. Entre las celebraciones que describe está la Epifanía, la observancia del nacimiento de Cristo y la procesión de gala en honor a su Presentación en el Templo 40 días después. Según la Ley Mosaica, una mujer era ritualmente "inmunda" durante 40 días después del parto, cuando debía presentarse a los sacerdotes y ofrecer sacrificios, su "purificación". El contacto con cualquier persona que había rozado el misterio —nacer o morir— estaba excluido. Una persona de culto judío. Esta fiesta enfatiza la primera aparición de Jesús en el Templo más que la purificación de María.

La observancia se extendió por toda la Iglesia occidental en los siglos quinto y sexto. Debido a que la Iglesia en Occidente celebró el nacimiento de Jesús el 25 de diciembre, la Presentación se trasladó al 2 de febrero, 40 días después de Navidad.

A principios del siglo VIII, el papa Sergio inauguró una procesión a la luz de las velas; A finales del mismo siglo, la bendición y distribución de velas que continúa hasta hoy se convirtió en parte de la celebración, dando a la fiesta su nombre popular: Candlemas.

### Reflexión

En el relato de Lucas, Jesús fue recibido en el templo por dos personas mayores, Simeón y la viuda Anna. Encarnan a Israel en su paciente expectativa; ellos reconocen al niño Jesús como el Mesías tan esperado. Las primeras referencias a la fiesta romana lo llaman la fiesta de San Simeón, el anciano que estalló en una canción de alegría que la Iglesia todavía canta al final del día. ## **MEDITACIÓN EVANGÉLICO**

Cuarenta días después de la Navidad celebramos la Fiesta de la Presentación del Señor que narra la siguiente descripción según el Evangelio de San Lucas: "Asimismo, cuando llegó el día en que, de acuerdo a la Ley de Moisés, debían cumplir el rito de la purificación, llevaron al niño a Jerusalén para presentarlo al Señor, tal como está escrito en la Ley del Señor: *Todo varón primogénito será consagrado al Señor*. También ofrecieron el sacrificio que ordena la Ley

del Señor: *una pareja de tórtolas o dos pichones*." (Lucas 2:22-24). Presentarse al templo para cumplir con la ley era un requisito muy importante para la familia de Nazaret. Allí, ellos encontraron al anciano Simeón, un hombre justo y temeroso de Dios, y Ana, sabia profetisa. Ambos reconocieron en Jesús la esperanza y la luz para el pueblo de Israel.

En este día se bendicen las velas que significan que Jesús es la luz del mundo. "La liturgia de hoy nos muestra a Jesús que va al encuentro de su pueblo. Es la fiesta del encuentro: la novedad del Niño se encuentra con la tradición del templo; la promesa halla su cumplimiento; María y José, jóvenes, encuentran a Simeón y Ana, ancianos. Todo se encuentra, en definitiva, cuando llega Jesús. ¿Qué nos enseña esto? En primer lugar, que también nosotros estamos llamados a recibir a Jesús que viene a nuestro encuentro. Encontrarlo: al Dios de la vida hay que encontrarlo cada día de nuestra existencia; no de vez en cuando, sino todos los días. Seguir a Jesús no es una decisión que se toma de una vez por todas, es una elección cotidiana." (Papa Francisco) ¿Dónde se encuentra Jesús ahora?

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
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
